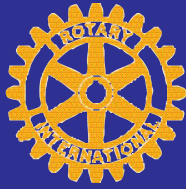

ROTARY FOUNDATION CENTENNIAL

Arch Klumph's idea for an endowment fund dedicated to "doing good in the world" planted the seed of The Rotary Foundation in 1917. Thanks to his vision and staunch advocacy, and the extraordinary generosity of Rotary members worldwide, that fund has become one of the world's leading humanitarian foundations.

Timeline History of The Foundation

- 1917 - Rotary President Arch Klumph proposes an endowment for doing good. The Rotary Club of Kansas City, MO makes the first donation of \$26.50.
- 1928 - The Rotary Foundation is formally named.
- 1930 - The Foundation awards \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children.
- 1947 - Rotary members contribute \$1.3 million in Paul Harris' memory.
- 1957 - Paul Harris Fellow recognition begins.
- 1963 - Matched Districts program is established.
- 1965 - Matching Grants program is launched and Group Study Exchanges begins.
- 1978 - Health, Hunger, and Humanity (3H) grants expand service efforts.
- 1979 - Rotary begins immunizing 6 million children in the Phillipines against polio.
- 1980 - Rotary commits to "eliminate polio through immunization".
- 1981 - The Foundation establishes the Endowment Fund.
- 1985 - The PolioPlus program is launched.
- 1988 - The multi-year PolioPlus campaign raises almost \$247 million and the World Health Assembly launches the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI).
- 1995 - The PolioPlus Partners program is created to support National Immunization Days.
- 1999 - The Rotary Peace Centers are founded.
- 2004 - The Every Rotarian, Every Year initiative is created.
- 2007 - The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation issues a \$100 million challenge.
- 2009 - Rotary and USAID launch the International H₂O Collaboration.
- 2013 - Simplified grant model goes into effect, introducing two new grant types: global and district.
- 2015 - Polio cases worldwide are down 99.9 percent since GPEI was launched in 1988.
- 2016 - The Foundation's Centennial Year begins on July 1.

The Object of Rotary

THE OBJECT of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Rotarian Code of Conduct

The following code of conduct has been adopted for the use of Rotarians: **AS A ROTARIAN**, I will:

- 1) Act with integrity and high ethical standards in my personal and professional life.
- 2) Deal fairly with others and treat them and their occupations with respect.
- 3) Use my professional skills through Rotary to: mentor young people, help those with special needs, and improve people's quality of life in my community and in the world.
- 4) Avoid behavior that reflects adversely on Rotary or other Rotarians.

OF THE THINGS we think, say or do:

- 1) Is it the **TRUTH**?
- 2) Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3) Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
- 4) Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?
